


WARNING CAR POLISHER

Any piece of equipment can be dangerous if not operated properly. **YOU** are responsible for the safe operation of this equipment. The operator must carefully read and follow any warnings, safety signs and instructions provided with or located on the equipment. Do not remove, defeat, deface or render inoperable any of the safety devices or warnings on this equipment. If any safety devices or warnings have been removed, defeated, defaced or rendered inoperable, **DO NOT USE THIS EQUIPMENT!!!**

This equipment requires a grounded 120-volt outlet, do not modify plug.

WARNING: Keep both hands on the polisher at all times and keep clear of rotating head.

Always wear eye protection when operating this tool.

IMPORTANT SAFETY RULES TO FOLLOW

1. Do not use power tools in damp or wet locations. Do not expose power tools to rain. Failure to follow these instructions increases the risk of electrocution.
2. Avoid gaseous areas. Do not operate electric tools in explosive atmospheres in presence of flammable liquids or gases. Sparks from the motor will ignite fumes.
3. Do not wear loose clothing or jewelry. Wear safety glasses at all times.
4. Always inspect polisher for frayed or damaged cords. Do not use if not working properly.
5. Avoid accidental starting. Don't carry plugged in polisher with finger on switch. Be sure the switch is in the "OFF" position before plugging into outlet.
6. Never connect a polisher to any source that does not match the voltage of the polisher.
7. Before you begin, make sure your car is clean and dry. The work area should be dry.
8. Always start and stop the polisher on or against the car surface.
9. Do not press down on the polisher. The machine's action, not pressure does the best job.
10. Hold the polisher level, using broad sweeping strokes to cover flat areas quickly.
11. Be extremely careful when working around the ridges and edges on your vehicle. Friction created by the polisher can burn the paint.
12. Keep the cord over your shoulder away from the polisher while operating.

If the person receiving this handout will not be the user of the equipment, forward these instructions to the operator. If there is any doubt as to the operation or safety of the equipment,
